Kia ora e te whānau

This morning our Bayly Park Senior Learning Village was blessed ready for our staff and students to move into next week and start their learning. It has been amazing to see the progress that has taken place over the last week, finishing touches will be put in place over the next couple of days.

We are holding our Individual Learning Programmes (ILP) meetings next Monday and Tuesday, if you have not made an appointment to see your child's whānau teacher then please ring the office. These meetings are a great opportunity for whānau to meet their child's teacher, set goals and their individual learning programme for the year. Students and their whānau will be given a chance to discuss the aspirations they have for their time at Te Paepae o Aotea and beyond. Students can collect their uniforms either before or after their ILP meeting from the Jubilee gym. We will have student helpers to meet and greet at each gate as **meetings will be in your child's whānau classroom** except the classes that will be housed at Bayly Park. These classes will have their meetings on the main school site to allow the construction and data teams a few more days to finish off. Course selection on parent portal has now been closed, any students who need to make selections or changes should now do so at their ILP meeting.

Next week we have our school pōwhiri at 10.00am on Wednesday February 1, this event marks the opening of our school and will be attended by various dignitaries. Everyone is welcome. If you are wanting to attend, please report to the HUB no later than 9.45am. Students need to be inside The HUB by 9.30am. Please note due to the large number of people expected to attend our pōwhiri, the barrier arms at The HUB will be in use from 8.30 – 12pm that morning to keep students and visitors safe. We are excited to be able to open our school to staff, students, and the community. On Wednesday students will not be required to have their full stationery, however, they should bring the basics (eg pen and refill).

## Traffic Safety Plan

Many of you will be aware that we have put in a submission to STDC to close Camberwell Road between the school gate and Stan Lay Drive between the hours of 8.30 – 3.30pm each day. This decision is going to council for consideration on 31 January. This means we will start the year without a permanent solution.

We are also aware that Waihi Road has significant roadworks currently and as a community we have not had over 1000 students on the Camberwell Road school site for a number of years. This means we will have to be very patient with one another as we learn our 'new normal'.

To help with traffic flow before and after school, we suggest we all adhere to the following:

- Reserve the HUB space before and after school for buses and our students who attend our Endeavour Centre.
- Our senior students park on Disraeli Street (Disraeli Street should be more convenient for you to access the Senior Learning Village at Bayly Park. Remember, if you are driving to school you should see Matua Mahaki to get a pass).
- Long term, we would like parents to pick students up from the Waihi Road part of the HUB, however, with the road works, it might be easier to allow your student to walk the first part and meet you on a nearby street e.g., High Street.
- Students can continue to ride bikes, scooter and skate to school. There is a cage at the front of Gray block where they can store their chosen mode of transport.

## Property Update

We are due to move into the Bayly Park Senior Learning Village next week and are thankful to the building team and sub-contractors that have gone above and beyond to ensure we are ready for the start of school. Our new furniture for Bayly Park from Furnware has arrived and is in place at Bayly Park looking fantastic.

The work that has been done to remodel several of our classroom spaces on the main school site is nearing completion and these will all be ready for student use next week. Members of the public are welcome to come and have a tour of our school spaces on Monday and Tuesday.

Significant work has also been done with our technology infrastructure; this means we will be delaying the issue of devices to students for a couple of weeks to ensure the system is running smoothly. Whānau teachers will still be asking students in their ILP meetings if they require a device for learning for the year. We will keep you posted in this space.
